

Jenni and Harrow representing BARRC, made a special trip out to Dalyellup Collage to meet with the amazing Jessica and Debbie her Education Assistant. Jess had raised nearly \$300 for BARRC making snuffle mats and we wanted to thank her in person.



Just over 2 years ago, Jessica was diagnosed with Covid, a diagnosis that brought with it a profound and unexpected side effect: a rapid and complete loss of her vision. At the time, doctors were unsure of how long the effects would last, leaving Jess and her family in a state of uncertainty. The exact condition that Jessica exhibits is unprecedented. As such, there are no known treatments and Jessica does not have a prognosis for the future. This condition completely prevents Jessica from functioning under normal circumstances. For a teenager who had always been academically driven and highachieving, the prospect of continuing her education without the ability to see was overwhelming.

However, Jess was determined to continue her studies. Rather than giving in to frustration or defeat, she began the challenging process of adapting to her new reality. With unwavering resolve, Jess repeated her Year 11 ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admission Rank) subjects, determined to work through the challenge with the right methods of learning. At first, she struggled with traditional classroom materials, such as textbooks, content on the board and handwritten notes, but she and her Education Assistant, worked tirelessly to find the best approach for her.

Through a process of trial and error, they experimented with alternative ways to access the curriculum.

Her resilience paid off when she repeated her Year 11 and Year 12 ATAR courses, achieving exceptional results, achieving awards in both Economics and Psychology. Her success has been an inspiration to her peers, teachers, and the wider school community.

Annual High Tea Fundraiser

A heartfelt thanks to Teresa for her tireless efforts and to Peel Manor for hosting our Annual BARRC High Tea in October.

This event raised an incredible \$2,600 through ticket sales, raffles, tombola and games. A true testament to the generosity of our supporters. We extend our gratitude to the businesses and individuals who donated items, making this event a resounding success.

This year, the funds were directed to helping a heavily pregnant mum who came into care just in time to deliver 11 beautiful puppies. Both mum and her pups required extra medical attention and your support has been instrumental in giving them a healthy start. We look forward to October this year when we can do it all again!

Miss Piggy Gabby



and so quirky. We feel so blessed to have him!




Xmas Catchup 2024

A Fresh Start for Our Long-Termers

2024 brought challenges for our long-termers, with no adoption interest and a waitlist longer than an Akita's tail. To help these dogs find homes, we introduced a \$50 adoption fee for select dogs.

In our April 2024 edition, we highlighted reduced adoption fees for long-termers. The success from that campaign made it worthwhile to do again in September.

While this reduced fee means we absorb a financial loss, it also provides new owners the chance to invest in training and support, ensuring a smoother transition for the dog into their new home.

Thanks to this initiative, some of our long-term residents are now enjoying their fresh start, giving these deserving dogs the second chance they need and whilst we're thrilled for those who found their forever homes, Sunny and Digby are still waiting patiently for theirs!

BARRC BY NUMBERS

Most common name for a female is still Rosie followed by Bella and Buddy and Rocky for the males
